The initial charter of the WMGA Foundation was to provide need based scholarships to young women pursuing their college degrees. Over time, the WMGA Foundation added to their mission, supporting junior girls' golf to continue to grow the great game our WMGA members love.

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2018 in Review

We would like to thank those who supported the WMGA Foundation in Fiscal 2018.

During 2018, we granted scholarships to nine new recipients and extended the scholarship grant to a past recipient for Law School. We also increased the award from \$1,000 to \$1,200 per semester.

Our 2018 Non-Event raised over \$28,000! We could not be more grateful or proud of our membership for its tremendous support. This amount reflects an increase of nearly \$8,000 over 2017.

We expanded *Girls to the Tee* to Long Island. Thank you to our host clubs, Westchester Country Club, Ridgewood Country Club and Smithtown Landing Country Club as well as over 30 PGA Pros, who donated their days off to provide expert instruction to nearly 200 junior girls.

Finally, thank you to our sponsor, Tory Sport.

As we turn the page on our fiscal year, we remain committed to our mission. 100% of our donations go to our programs. The more funds raised equals more support to young women pursuing their dreams. Olivia: *Fahrenheit 451*



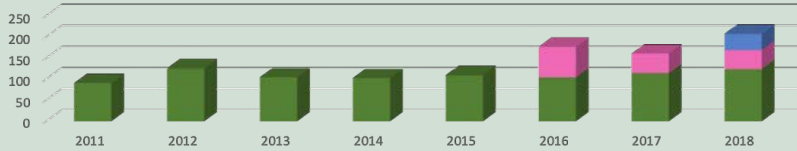

The 2018 US Junior Girls was played at Poppy Hills Golf Course in Pebble Beach, California and two of our juniors qualified. The 2017 championship was contested in Augusta, Missouri. Three of our juniors made it through local qualifying and two qualified for match-play.
