Carolyn also is an 11-time winner of the New Jersey State Women's Stroke Play Championship and six-time winner of the New Jersey Women's Match Play Championship.

Carolyn flew up to the Annual Meeting from her home in South Carolina to accept her award. Carolyn charmed the audience with remarks regarding her passion for the game and the blessings golf has bestowed upon her life.

At 90 years young, Carolyn, too, hopes that her game will improve! On any sunny afternoon you may find her teeing it up on the course at Myrtle Beach, working on her smooth and graceful swing. Thank you, Carolyn, for honoring the Annual Meeting with your joyful and spirited presence.


## 54<sup>th</sup> Husband-Wife "B" Championship




## **Met Rep Tournament**
