Corina Cetateanu of Middle Bay was a threat to the field again earning 3rd gross honors (159) in this and the Met Am tournaments.

Algiero, having a banner season with a win at the Met Am Championship a month earlier at Forest Hill Field Club, was thrilled with her victory. The few times when she was not able to reach the green in regulation she made some masterful up and downs to the hole. Laura's putter worked magic on both days and she believes that made all the difference.

Three cheers to Alpine for giving the WMGA its course for two days in the height of summer. The staff made such a special effort to keep our players calm and cool in the July heat wave making it a terrific test of golf.

Algiero Prevails at the Met Amateur

Forest Hill Field Club, June 8th

The 9th Women's Metropolitan Amateur Championship was played at the Forest Hill Field Club, in Bloomfield, NJ, on June 8th. The course delivered a daunting challenge to the field of 54 players. Laura Algiero, Westchester Hills, was crowned champion at the end of the day with a round of 82, and no one was more surprised than Laura to learn that her round stood up among a core of extremely talented golfers.

Algiero's consistency on this Tillinghast design was the primary reason for her victory. She shot 10 pars which was the most among the competitors. Her round began unexpectedly, reaching the 1st green in regulation she promptly four-putted to come away with a double-bogey. At that point Laura thought to herself, "Oh, boy, this is going to be some round!" Laura righted the ship from there and used her accurate shot making to par the four par 3's on the course and birdied the par-5 11th hole. Perhaps she saved her best for last on Forest Hill's signature 18th hole, a 160 yard par 3 that slopes severely uphill to a two tiered, intricately contoured green that is well-protected on both sides by deep bunkers and in front by 40 yards of thick rough. This proved to be the most difficult hole on the golf course, yielding only 8 pars on the day. Laura navigated the hole brilliantly and sunk a par putt. Well done, Laura!

Cheryl Brayman, North Shore, also played a very steady round of golf and placed 2nd in the gross category with a score of 83 in a match of cards. Corina Cetateanu, Middle Bay, earned 3rd gross with an 83. The net trophy was won by Ellie Yum, Plainfield West 9, in a match of cards with a 79. Jo Rasmussen, Longshore, took 2nd net with a 79. LeeAnn Lewis, Southward Ho, shot a 81 to earn the 3rd net prize.

It does not dictate shot selection but invites creative solutions as to how to navigate the dunes to the hole.


