

## WOMEN PLAY FINE GOLF.

### Miss Mix, Mrs. Morgan, Miss Hyde, and Mrs. Polhemus in Semi-Finals.

Miss Julla R. Mix of Englewood, Mrs. W. Fellowes Morgan of Baltusrol, Miss L. B. Hyde of Bay Shore, and Mrs. T. H. Polhemus of Richmond County will figure as the principals in the semi-final round of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association championship tournament in progress on the Montclair links. They will meet as named to-day.

One of the first matches in the opening round to be settled was between Miss Mix and Mrs. W. J. Faith of Wykagyl. While not at her best with the irons, the title-holder made few mistakes off the tee, and as Mrs. Faith had little luck on the greens the final outcome was never in doubt.

A fine recovery from the bunker guarding the ninth green enabled Mrs. Faith to get a halve there in three, but even that left her four down at the turn, Miss Mix having gone out in 46. These figures are creditable when it is taken into consideration that the outward holes cover more than 3,200 yards.

Sixes at the tenth and eleventh by the champion enabled Mrs. Faith to win those holes, but thereafter Miss Mix proved too steady, winning three out of the next four holes and the match by 5 up and 3 to play. The summary:

### Equals World's Record at Traps.

At the invitation trap shooting tournament held at the Clove Valley Rod and Gun Club a squad composed of T. O'Donahue, New York Athletic Club; F. B. Stephenson, Crescent; F. A. Hodgman, New York Athletic Club; H. M. Brigham, Crescent, and F. H. Schauffler, New York Athletic Club, equaled the world's record by breaking 124 out of 125 clay birds. The previous record was made at Ossining some five years ago. F. A. Hodgman was high gun for the two days, breaking 483 out of 500 and 99 out of his first 100. L. M. Palmer, Jr., made a run of 92 straight at 19 and 20 yards in the distance handicap events. The guests were members of the New York Athletic Club, Crescent, and Larchmont Yacht Club teams. The club has a shooting and fishing preserve of 25,000 acres in Dutchess County, about ten miles south of Milbrook.

### Dick Donnelly Off for London.

Dick Donnelly sailed on the Mauretania for England yesterday under contract with L. LeVinnos of Antwerp, who will show at the International Horse Show in London next week, and who will take a string of jumpers over Europe. After the various Continental shows come to an end Donnelly will visit Ireland to pick up the best jumpers he can buy for certain of the crack cavalry regiments in the German, French, and Italian Armies. He will probably not be back in the United States until nearly the end of the year.
