

GEORGIANNA BISHOP LEADS WOMEN'S GOLF

Brooklawn Girl Captures First Honors in Metropolitan Qualifying Round.

Miss Georgianna M. Bishop of Brooklawn, former National champion and twice winner of the metropolitan title, led the field in the qualifying round in the annual tournament of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association at the Englewood Country Club yesterday, with a score of 89, and added another trophy to her list. She was 11 strokes better than her nearest competitor, Mrs. Lawrence Swift, of the home club, who had 100, while Mrs. M. D. Paterson, President of the association, was third with 103.

Miss Bishop played excellent golf, with one or two exceptions, and she successfully avoided trouble for the greater part of the way. She started out with a par four at the 380-yard first hole, and added another at the second, some 343 yards, but was unable to keep up the pace at the third, and got into difficulty going to the fourth. She recovered well, however, and repeated her par performance at the seventh, which she did in three. She went along smoothly thereafter and at the eleventh she ran down a long put for a six, following it with a par four, and continuing at this pace until the sixteenth green, 417 yards, where she required seven strokes. Another long put on the seventeenth green gave her par figures in four, and a bit of luck on the home hole permitted her to save at least a stroke. She drove to the edge of the terrace forming the side of the green. On her second shot she would have been way over, but her ball struck the cup and came to rest stone dead, so that she had an easy put for a three. Her card:
