

MRS. GAVIN LOSES TO MISS BISHOP

Brooklawn Golfer to Play Mrs. Feitner in Metropolitan Final Match Today.

Miss Georgianna M. Bishop of Brooklawn, former national champion, stepped into the limelight at the women's metropolitan championship yesterday by eliminating Mrs. W. A. Gavin, women's Eastern champion, in the semi-final round of the tournament at Baltusrol by the margin of 2 up. The little Englishwoman put up a great fight under a heavy strain, as Miss Bishop held the lead at almost every stage of the match. The former national champion's nerve and tournament experience stood her in good stead in the tight finish, and she clinched the match on the home hole when Mrs. Gavin buried her ball and her hopes of the metropolitan title in the big pit short of the green. Mrs. Quentin F. Feitner of South Shore, the defending champion, won the other semi-final match, 8 up and 6 to play, from Mrs. F. D. Ryan of Cranford, and will encounter Miss Bishop this morning in the final round.

The international flavor of the Gavin-Bishop match attracted a fair gallery that followed the players over hill and dale in spite of the rain. Miss Bishop took the lead on the first hole with a thirty-foot putt, and, except for a temporary setback at the eighth hole, she was never worse than even with her opponent during the round of the course. On the eighth hole Miss Bishop had no difficulty in locating the pit short of the green, which is so popular with Mrs. Feitner. For this side-excursion Miss Bishop lost the hole and was 1 down, but she won the ninth and was all square at the turn.

The Brooklawn player was so steady on the next three holes that she won them in succession, when Mrs. Gavin faltered in her putting. A long putt on the thirteenth green won for the Englishwoman, but when she missed an eighteen-inch putt on the fourteenth, where Miss Bishop holed out from a distance of eight feet, she found herself three down again. Miss Bishop lost the fifteenth and seventeenth with a variety of missed shots, leaving the match dormie 1.

Having sliced her tee shot on the home hole into some trees, Mrs. Gavin proceeded to make a bad matter worse by sending her second into the wide trap that guards the home green. Here she took two ineffectual shots, dispersing much sand and dispelling all hope, and then picked up her ball and congratulated Miss Bishop, who had a sure four for the victory.

Mrs. Ryan indicated on the first hole in her match against Mrs. Feitner that the result would never be in doubt. She got trapped on her third shot, stayed in on her fourth, popped out on the edge with her fifth, and popped back in again with her sixth. A nine was a conservative estimate for her on this hole, and after playing several other holes in similar style, Mrs. Ryan was five down at the turn. The only hole lost by Mrs. Feitner was the eighth, where she made her accustomed stop-over in the bunker short of the green and took three useless shots. Three successive winning holes by Mrs. Feitner after the turn clinched the match on the twelfth green, 8 up and 6 to play. The summaries:

BOXING PROMOTERS WARNED

State Commission Demands Contracts of Moran-Dillon Bout.

The violations of several of the regulations of the State Athletic Commission in regard to the ten-round bout scheduled for June 29 between Moran and Dillon were yesterday called to the attention of the management of the Washington Park Sports and Amusement Club in the following letter, signed by William F. Mathewson, Secretary of the boxing board:

"At a recent meeting of the State Athletic Commission it was noted that Frank Moran and Jack Dillon are advertised to box at your club on June 29.

"I am instructed to call your attention to Rule 8 of Part 2, which stipulates that copies of all contracts between clubs and boxers must be executed in triplicate and one copy filed with this commission.

"I am further instructed to inform you that, in case either or both of the contestants in the above match are working on guarantee, the amount of said guarantee must be posted, with a surety satisfactory to this commission, at or before noon of the day preceding the contest, as per Rule 20 of Part 2."

Harry Pollock, Dan McKetrick, and Jack Curley are promoting the coming contest. When the bout was arranged it was announced that Moran would receive \$25,000 and a certain percentage of the receipts as his share, while Dillon was said to have been guaranteed \$15,000. Part of the purse was posted with a stakeholder, and announcement was made that the remainder would be placed in his hands several days before the contest takes place.
