

Judy Frank and Mrs. Cudone Gain in Metropolitan Golf

DEFENDER DOWNS MRS. BUCHSBAUM

Miss Frank Wins by 7 and 6
in Opening-Round Match
—Mrs. Trepner Beaten

GLEN HEAD, L. I., June 18—
The Women's Metropolitan Golf Association's fifty-fourth annual match-play championship found all the top favorites advancing as the first round was completed today. Competition was over the 6,552-yard, par-74 Glen Head course.

Judy Frank of Old Oaks and Mrs. Philip Cudone of Montclair, co-medalists with 79's yesterday, advanced without much trouble against home-club players.

Miss Frank, the 22-year-old defending champion, defeated Mrs. Marvin Buchsbaum, 7 and 6. Judy was 5 up after nine holes, carding a two-over-par 38.

Mrs. Cudone, a Curtis Cup player and winner of the Metropolitan in 1955, met Mrs. Samuel Trepner. The Jersey golfer also was out in 38 and stood 3 up. Mrs. Trepner managed to shoot par to take the twelfth, her only winning hole. The Montclair player captured the next two holes to close the match, 5 and 4.

Mrs. Untermeyer Bows

What might be called a surprise was the triumph of Mrs. Marge Mason of Ridgewood by the margin of 7 and 6 over Mrs. Sophie Untermeyer of Century. Mrs. Mason, the Metropolitan champion in 1952, played the match at a record-breaking clip. After it was over she completed the remaining holes to report a two-under-women's-par 36, 36—72. Mrs. Untermeyer had kept up with her opponent until the sixth hole.

Mrs. Mason will meet 19-year-old Judy Mintz of Glen Oaks in the second round. Mrs. Mason broke Judy's record of 75 in the first round. Miss Mintz, playing in her first Metropolitan championship, advanced at the expense of Mrs. F. K. Thayer Jr. of Piping Rock, 5 and 3.

Scoring comparatively easy victories were two other former Metropolitan champions, Mrs. Reinert M. Torgerson of Meadow Brook and Mrs. Mortimer May of Englewood.

Mrs. May, the recent winner of the Long Island match-play championship, won from the Westchester-Fairfield champion, Mrs. Joseph A. Nesbitt of Westchester, 4 and 3.

Mrs. Torgerson had to rally several times in her match with Mrs. Pete Cassella of Brookville before reaching the turn all even. After the tenth and eleventh holes had been halved, Mrs. Torgerson, a three-time Metropolitan champion, won the twelfth to go 1 up. She lost the thirteenth and then won three holes in a row to close out the match, 3 and 2.
