GIRL GOLFER TELLS OF BESTING PRINCE

Beatrice Gottlieb Returns With Trophies of Victory From British Heir.

FOUND HIM 'TERRIBLY NICE'

She Wonders What He Thought When She Said, 'Oh, Nerts!'

After a Bad Shot.

Miss Beatrice Gottlieb, the only woman to beat the Prince of Wales at golf, returned yesterday on the United States liner President Roosevelt very proud of the autographed score card and the box of golf balls given to her by the vanquished. She said she played with the Prince three times, twice to a tie. The third time she won.

"He is most companionable to play with," she said. "He certainly loves the game. We played at three different courses, Sunningdale, Wentworth and Coomb Hill, all near London. I had tea with him twice, after going around. Archie Compston, the Prince's private professional, and Mrs. Allistair Mackintosh of London completed the foursome with us, but I played against the Prince."

Miss Gottlieb said she had been playing for several days on the same links as the Prince, sometimes ahead of and sometimes behind him. One day he asked his professional to arrange a match with her.

She said she thought the Prince "terribly nice" and wondered what he thought of her because once she made a bad shot and said "Oh, nerts!" The Prince just laughed.

She said it should not be taken for granted that he had been chivalrous to the extent of not trying to beat her.

"We played for a ball a hole and when he lost the seventh hole you should have heard what he said. But I'd better not tell you."

When the girl, who is the only American girl ever to play with the Prince, had won from him and accepted his autographed score card and golf balls she presented to the Prince an iron which Bobby Jones used in his last British open match. The Prince, she said, seemed "very grateful."

Miss Gottlieb has been away for four months. She will stay at the Hotel Winslow, 45 East Fifty-fifth Street.

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
