

1952 Final 'Replayed'

Roslyn Swift Is Victor This Time in Met. Golf

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., June 18.—The final round match of last year's woman's Metropolitan golf championship was replayed at Metropolis today with a reversal that resulted when Roslyn Swift, a most attractive young golfer from Glen Oaks, L. I., defeated Mrs. Marge Mason, the defending champion from Ridge-wood, N. J., 3 and 1 in the quarter-final round of the fiftieth tournament. Mrs. Mason had defeated her young rival 2 and 1 in the thirty-six-hole final a year ago.

New Jersey is well represented in the semi-finals to be played tomorrow, however, since Mrs. Philip Cudone, of Montclair, defeated a former champion, Mrs. Mortimer May, of Englewood, 2 and 1 and Mrs. William Tracy, of Glen Ridge, turned back Mrs. George Brady, of Scarsdale, 5 and 3.

The fourth quarter-final match, which figured as one of the good ones of the tournament, was not played because of the default of Mrs. Sophie Untermeyer, of Century, to Mrs. Reinert Torgerson, of Cherry Valley. Mrs. Untermeyer was unable to play because of the sudden illness of her father.

Fine Match Looms

Miss Swift and Mrs. Cudone were both playing quite well today and their meeting in the upper semi-final tomorrow might easily furnish the most closely contested, if not the best match of the tournament. Miss Swift's victory was a bit easier since she got away to 2-up lead over Mrs. Mason after two holes and never was pulled back to even terms, although Mrs. Mason reduced the lead to one hole on four occasions later on.

But the champion was not driving well. Her tee shots were rather erratic. She was 2 down when her drive was trapped at the sixteenth, which required her to take four shots for this par-3 hole of 143 yards while Miss Swift chipped up for an orthodox 3.

Now 2 down with two holes left, Mrs. Mason again put her tee shot into a bunker, this time a grass one at the seventeenth, and, chipping far too strongly, had to concede the match to Miss Swift's stone dead chip from the fringe.

Trouble on Greens

Mrs. Cudone had some trouble on the greens, where she left herself far too much to do and did not do it well. But her opponent, Mrs. May, missed putts too, a couple of them at most vital moments. The match really was won at the 415-yard tenth hole, where Mrs. Cudone played a wonderful second shot to within eight feet of the pin and went down for an eagle 3. Mrs. Cudone was 2 up at the fourteenth of 406 yards and then they halved the next three holes.

Mrs. Tracy took three putts at the first hole to give Mrs. Brady a 1-up lead, but after she got no worse than a half with a 6 at the 305-yard second, she got her game and the match well in hand by winning four of the next five holes with four pars and a birdie. Thereafter she kept picking up holes with par golf and her victory was really one-sided.
