

MRS. KIRKLAND GAINS LINKS PRIZE WITH 79

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., June 3—A visitor from Long Island won low gross honors today in the first one-day tournament of the Westchester division, Women's Metropolitan Golf Association.

Over the difficult 6,372-yard, par-76 Metropolis Country Club course, Mrs. William R. Kirkland Jr. of the Piping Rock Club in Locust Valley shot a three-over-par 39, 40—79 to lead the largest field in the history of women's metropolitan one-day tournaments.

There were 102 players and more than fifty others had to be turned away. Sixteen contestants came from Long Island.

Several of the Long Islanders gave this reason for coming to Metropolis: "We know Woodmere and wanted to see another course."

Mrs. Sophie Untermeyer of Century, a former Metropolitan champion, was second to Mrs. Kirkland for the low gross prize. She had a 39, 41—80.

Mrs. Fred Stein Jr. of Century was the winner of the net prize with a 90—15—75, Mrs. Kirkland, the Long Island medal play champion, had a net score of 79—5—74, but having won the gross prize, she was ineligible for the net prize.
