

Mrs. Cici Is Golf Winner

Her 79 Defeats Mrs. Pesci
in WMGA Shore Playoff

DEAL—Mrs. Pat Cici of Lido Country Club in Long Beach, N.Y., won the Women's Metropolitan Golf Assn. Jersey Shore championship today in a play-off, scoring 79 against 83 posted by Mrs. Peter Pesci of the Dellwood Country Club, New York.

Mrs. Cici, the wife of a golf pro and the sister of six golf pros, was four over par for the 6,105-yard Hollywood Golf Club course. She took the lead on the third hole and never trailed.

DEAL—"Slats" is in a playoff today at the Hollywood Golf Club for the Metropolitan Women's Golf Assn. Jersey Shore championship.

"Slats" is an ex-chorus girl. Her full name nowadays is Mrs. Peter Pesci and she is a member of the Dellwood Country Club, which is just over the New Jersey State line in New York.

"Slats," whose maiden name was McKinney, shot a two-over-par 77 yesterday at the Hollywood Golf Club course in the final session of the tournament to tie Mrs. Pat Cici of the Lido Club of Long Island at 242 for three rounds. Mrs. Cici, dark-haired, good-looking wife of a golf professional, also is the sister of five pros—the Stuhler brothers. One of her brothers, Ed, used to be pro at Cedar Hill in Livingston. Another, George, was a winner of the Met. Open 9 or 10 years ago.

Both "Slats" and Pat came virtually from nowhere to take over the tournament's top spots. Mrs. Cici played the front nine at Hollywood in 36, one under par, then had a couple of double bogeys and staggered around the last nine in 42. Mrs. Pesci struggled for a 40 on the first nine and when she came to the 400-yard 18th, a par-five for women, she was aware that she needed a birdie four to tie. Her second shot was 10 yards shy of the green, but she chipped six feet short of the hole and then made the putt for a one-under-par 37 back.

Today's playoff will be at 18 holes, starting at 10 a.m.

Unpopular 85s

Mrs. Marge Mason of Ridgewood, the 36-hole leader at 160, soared to 85 and said, quite simply, "I played awfully." Later she took a lesson from Hollywood pro Lou Barbaro, the State Open champ. Mrs. A. P. Slaner of Westchester's Old Oaks, two-day

runnerup with 161, a shot behind Mrs. Mason, also had 85, and Mrs. Bernard Freeman of Inwood, L.I., who was a contender after having shot 163 for two rounds, also had 85. It was not a popular score.

Martha Kaus of the Westchester Country Club, who led the affair with an opening 78, kept fading as she put an 88 on top of an 87. That wasn't too bad, however, for an 18-year-old gal who was competing in her first big tournament.

Mrs. Theodore W. Hawes of Baltusrol was the net winner with 257—33—224. Miss Kaus picked up second net, scoring 253—27—226.
