

MRS. CICI, WITH 236, TRIUMPHS IN JERSEY

DEAL, N.J., July 29—Mrs. Pat Cici of the Cedar Brook, (L.I.) Country Club won the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association's 32d annual New Jersey Shore tournament today with a 54-hole total of 236.

Mrs. Cici, whose husband and four brothers are golf pros, scored a 37, 40—77, the tournament's best round on the Hollywood Golf Club's 5,925-yard, par 37, 37—74 course. Mrs. A. Sherburne Hart of Essex County, whose 40, 40—80 gave her a 242, was second.

Mrs. Cici Loves the Shore Courses

OCEAN TOWNSHIP — "I think I'll play more tournaments in Jersey," summed up Mrs. Pat Cici, after the Cedar Brook, N.H., player won the 32nd Shore Championship of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association yesterday. She had 236 for the 54 holes.

The wife of the Cedar Brook pro was the only player to break 80 or over the rugged Hollywood Golf Club, with a 77 to whip the 130-girl field by six strokes. It was the second time she has won the Shore Trophy, having ventured over the Hudson back in 1959, the first and only time before she had entered the big event.

She shot 81 at Rumson Country Club to share second place behind Miss Charlotte DeCozen of Westchester Country Club the first day; then fired a 78 Wednesday at the Deal Golf & Country Club to grab a three-stroke margin going into yesterday's final 18 over the 5,925-yd., par 37-37-74 Hollywood course.

Second place was the sole property of Mrs. A. Shelburne Hart of Essex County Country Club, who fired 80 yesterday for a three-day total of 242.

Seven shots further back was Mrs. Alexander Munro, of Innis Arden, Conn., whose 82 gave her 249. Mrs. William Tracy, Essex Fells, the winner of this tournament three of the last five years, rallied from an 88 at Deal to score 81 yesterday and take a share of fourth place with three others at 250.

They were Mrs. Oliver Vietor, Rumson; Mrs. DeWitt Alexandre, Somerset Hills, the WMGA tournament chairman; and Mrs. E. Kip Finch, Country Club of New Canaan, Conn.

Mrs. Alexandre collected the George Stillman plate for low net, with her 10-shot handicap clipping her 250 to 220 for the 54 holes.

Mrs. William A. Sullivan, Deal, who is currently in the finals of the President's Trophy event at her own course against Miss Elsie Sokol, wound up with

second net honors on her 259-33—226.

Tied for third were Mrs. Victor, Mrs. Finch, and Mrs. Anthony Dreyspool, Fairview.

Mrs. Cici, who has six brothers in the golf pro field, and whose husband is president of the Metropolitan PGA, played steady golf over Hollywood's lush acreage. She was one under par after six holes, after sinking an 18-hooter for a deuce at the 135-yd. fourth. She caught a trap on the 460-yd. seventh for a front-nine bogey to match par going out.

She missed the green at the 345-yd. 11th, three-putted the

dogleg 309-yd. 13th, and dropped her approach in the deep gully on the 330-yd. 14th, for bogeys.

But she hit a wedge stiff for a tap-in birdie at the 420-yd. 16th and went back to four over when her approach at 18 caught another trap. She putted only 30 times.

Mrs. Hart, playing the game six years, and competitively for two, started bogey-bogey and birdied the seventh for her 40 going out. Coming home, she double-bogied the 191-yd. 17th and bogied 18 for another 40.

"Anytime I break 80 I'm happy," said Mrs. Cici, who had

two of the three sub-80 rounds. Mrs. Finch shot a 79 at Deal.

Miss DeCozen, four shots back after 36 holes, turned in no card yesterday when an old wrist injury acted up on her. "I'll play it strictly as a practice round," she said on the first tee. She won the title in 1951.

Cedar Brook players have held the crown four times now, Mrs. Kenneth Springer winning in 1963. She won in 1962 as Miss Mary Ann Doctor, daughter of the Cedar Brook pro, Steve Doctor.
