Atkinson jury picked

SAN FRANCISCO AP — Jury selection began in federal court Thursday in the \$3,000 bank embezzlement and larceny trial of Oakland Raiders defensive halfback George Atkinson.

Atkinson was indicted on four counts of inducing two women bank tellers to steal or cash bank drafts, cashiers checks and money orders for him in late 1973 and early 1974. The women were not indicted.

U.S. District Court Judge William T. Sweigert is presiding over the trial. Atkinson is free on \$10,000 bail.
