

Mrs. Federman Wins in Jersey Shore Title Golf

Takes 86 at Hollywood for Total of 251 for 3 Days; Mrs. Ransahoff Second

DEAL, N. J., July 26.—No one seems to know just how many bunkers there are on the sand-scarred Hollywood Golf Club links, but Miss Jane Brooks, of Rockland County, is authority for the statement that "there are plenty." She found so many of them in the final round of the women's New Jersey shore championship that she dropped not only her title but sank to third place.

Mrs. Leo Federman, of Glen Oaks, a leader from the start with an 83 at Rumson and an 82 at Norwood, added an 86 on the third eighteen here for a winning total of 251. She, too, found the bunkers, troublesome but made some fine recoveries and added two strokes to her advantage over Miss Brooks. One player who paid only an occasional visit to the many traps was Mrs. Arthur Ransahoff, recently arrived into the metropolitan district from New Orleans. She matched Mrs. Federman's closing day 86 and took second place with a 258-stroke total, seven behind the leader, and one ahead of the unsuccessful defender. Miss Kathryn Bragaw, of Essex County, turned in an 88 for fourth honors at 260.

One Over Tournament Record

Numerous prizes were distributed after the third round was completed. Mrs. Federman had some of the sting taken out of her New York State championship defeat last Saturday by Miss Helen Hicks, a former holder of this title. Incidentally, her 251 missed the tournament record of 250 jointly held by the Misses Hicks and Brooks and Mrs. Martha Parker Amend. Among other prize collectors was Mrs. Arthur Lehman, of Century, sister-in-law of the Governor of New York, whose three-day net of 238 was honored. Actually, Mrs. Ransahoff, with a net of 231, was low, but she was restricted to the runner-up award.

Mrs. Ransahoff's round was the most talked of effort today. This was the first time she had tried this famous seashore links, yet she never got higher than 6 and did not use up more than two putts on a single green. She visited only three bunkers and there are hundreds strewn about the layout waiting for slightly errant shots. An uphill ten-foot putt at the eighteenth gave her the runner-up position over Miss Brooks.

Miss Brooks in Early Trouble

The 1932 champion, who beat Mrs. Amend in a playoff last July, had the distinction of recording the lowest round of the tourney, her 79 at Norwood the second day, but she found Hollywood not at all suited to her golf today. She was trapped at the first and second, where she took 6s; again at the sixth and seventh, was out of bounds at the tenth and returned to the bunkers at the thirteenth, fifteenth, sixteenth and eighteenth. At the fifteenth she needed two to get out when her first try hit a set of steps placed there to assist the weary. Usually by this hole Hollywood has its golfers weary.

Two three-putt greens and a badly flubbed approach stood out as the glaring errors in Miss Federman's final card. There were others, of course, but these prevented her, more than anything else, from breaking the tournament record. She had a chance to tie it with pars at the last two holes, but sclafted a short approach at the seventeenth and reached a bunker with her wood second at the eighteenth.

Miss Bragaw's Near Ace

Miss Bragaw's chief trouble was a 7 at the fifth, where she cut under a mashie niblick second and buried the ball in a bunker. It took two to remove it and a three-putt green followed. She almost scored a hole in one at the fifteenth, the ball resting inches away.
