

Mrs. Hockenjos Gains Title Golf Final

CRESTMONT GOLFER TRIUMPHS AT 18TH

TO MEET IN FINAL FOR NEW JERSEY GOLF TITLE

Mrs. Hockenjos Defeats Miss Glutting, 1 Up, as 15-Foot Putt Ends Close Match

MISS MILLER IS VICTOR

Halts Miss Irwin on Home Green in New Jersey Play—Faces Clubmate Today

UPPER MONTCLAIR, N. J., Sept. 21—Two Crestmont Club players reached the final of the seventeenth annual New Jersey State women's golf championship today when Mrs. William Hockenjos Jr. defeated the four-time winner of this event, Miss Charlotte Glutting, by 1 up in eighteen holes, and Miss Jean Miller eliminated Miss Laddie Irwin of the home club by a similar margin over the Upper Montclair links.

Neither match produced championship golf. In fact the scoring in the feature contest between Mrs. Hockenjos and Miss Glutting was disappointing as they barely managed to break 90, a score which would have prevented them from qualifying on Monday, when Mrs. Hockenjos took medal honors with a record 78.

In the upper half encounter between Miss Miller, who gained the first flight via a play-off, and Miss Laddie Irwin—two of the youngest players in the tournament—the scoring was mediocre for the first nine holes but improved on the back stretch.

Seeks Title Second Time

Tomorrow Mrs. Hockenjos, who has been a three-time finalist, will endeavor to win her second State title, her first having come in 1936 at Echo Lake. Her young opponent, Miss Miller, never had qualified until this year.

The medalist started out today by winning the first hole when Miss Glutting took three from the edge, but lost this advantage on the third when she put her second shot in the trap. Mrs. Hockenjos went 1 up again on the sixth by virtue of an 8-foot putt for a par 5. It was here that Miss Glutting dubbed her approach, sending it no more than three feet, an unfortunate mishap that shattered her confidence so that she never was able to gain a lead on her foe. Charlotte also dropped the eighth to be 2 down at the turn.

By snaring the tenth with a birdie 4 and the eleventh, when her opponent three-putted, Miss Glutting squared the match, but this was her last stand as they alternated at giving away holes after that. Mrs. Hockenjos went 1 up with a par 3 at the seventeenth, while her opponent put her drive in the water; then the battle ended as each took a 5 at the next hole, Mrs. Hockenjos sinking a 15-foot putt to halve the hole.

Miss Irwin Fails on Greens

In the other match Miss Irwin practically three-putted herself out of the championship as she took three on the greens to lose the third, sixth and eighth holes, reaching the turn 2 down. After winning the tenth with a birdie 4 when she sank her only long putt of the day, Laddie looked as if she might pull the match out of the fire, but Miss Miller had other ideas.

Jean won the twelfth by sinking a four-footer for a par 4 and went 3 up on the short thirteenth, where she carded a birdie 2, Laddie needing a 3. Miss Irwin reduced her deficit by winning the dog-leg fifteenth in par 4 and the seventeenth in par 3. Miss Miller managed to hang on to her slim lead by playing her third shot to the eighteenth within twenty feet of the pin for a sure half in 5 as Miss Irwin drove into a trap and was unable to get home in less than 3.
