# New Jersey Women Keep Team Prize on Montclair

## WINNING FIFTEEN SCORES 18 POINTS

Miss Orcutt Triumphs Twice  
to Help New Jersey—Miss  
Bragaw Double Victor

### LONG ISLAND IS SECOND

Finishes With 15½ Tallies,  
Westchester With 11½ in  
Triangular Matches

MONTCLAIR, N. J., May 23—The  
New Jersey women's team of fif-  
teen successfully defended the Golf  
Illustrated trophy, emblematic of  
supremacy in the metropolitan in-  
tersectional Spring competition, by  
defeating Long Island and West-  
chester over the third and fourth  
nines of the Montclair Golf Club  
course today.

When the results of the first five  
matches were posted, Long Island  
had a total of 8½ out of a possible  
10 points, while New Jersey was  
second with 4½, but when the final  
and fifteenth match was in, New  
Jersey was out in front with 18 tal-  
lies, against 15½ for Long Island  
and 11½ for Westchester.

Mrs. Harry McNaughton of Plan-  
dome, metropolitan champion, play-  
ing No. 1 for Long Island, gained  
2 points by conquering the New  
Jersey State champion, Mrs. Wil-  
liam Hockenjos Jr., by 6 and 5, and  
at the same time accounting for  
Miss Polly Andrews of Westchester,  
3 and 6.

### Champion in Good Form

It will be over this same course that Mrs. McNaughton will be called upon to defend her metropolitan title starting a week from Monday, and her score of 83 today over a hilly and very wet course shows that the Plandome star is well on her game.

There were only five two-point winners for New Jersey, among whom was Miss Maureen Orcutt of White Beeches, playing No. 2, who won by 4 and 2 from the Long Island match-play champion, Mrs. R. M. Torgerson of Lakeville, and by 5 and 4 from Mrs. James M. Robbins of Lawrence Farms.

It wasn't until Miss La Junta White of Englewood, in the No. 8 position, reported a 3-and-2 victory over Mrs. R. P. Limburg of the Century Club and a 2-up triumph over Mrs. F. K. Thayer Jr. of Women's National that two more points were added for New Jersey.

Other double winners for the defending champions included Mrs. Albert Becker of Englewood, No. 9, who scored by 4 and 3 against Mrs. Henry March, the Long Island team captain, and by 3 and 2 against Mrs. David H. Sulzberger of Century, and Mrs. E. E. Alley of Ridgewood, who defeated Mrs. J. C. Dey Jr. of the Women's National, 4 and 3, and Mrs. C. P. Luckey of Lawrence Farms, 3 and 2.

### Miss Bragaw Wins Twice

With the outcome of the matches hanging in the balance, Miss Kathryn Bragaw of Englewood in the last threesome, clinched victory for the New Jersey team when she registered triumphs over Mrs. J. B. Balding and Mrs. B. C. Baum.

Long Island seemed well on the way to victory when Mrs. McNaughton, Mrs. Charles Leichner, No. 3; Mrs. William Kirkland Jr., No. 4; Mrs. V. D. Crisp, No. 10; Miss Louise Iselin, No. 13, and Mrs. E. G. Richmond, No. 14, all registered two-point victories and their close defeat by New Jersey was a deep disappointment to them.

Two Green Meadow players were the only Westchester representatives to take two points each, Mrs. Archie McLave, at No. 7, and Mrs. T. A. Menzel, at 12, chalking up substantial victories over their New Jersey and Long Island opponents.
