

MRS. TRACY FIRST ON LINKS WITH 80

Captures Class A Low Gross
in Opening Jersey Tourney
—Net to Mrs. Lasser

NORTH CALDWELL, N. J.
April 26—Mrs. William Tracy of
Glen Ridge, New Jersey State
champion, showed the way to a
large group of Class A and B
women players today in the open-
ing one-day tournament of the
New Jersey division of the Wo-
men's Metropolitan Golf Associa-
tion over the Green Brook Country
Club. Mrs. Tracy turned in 41,
39—80 to win low gross honors
in the Class A group.

Although both groups play over
the same course, in the New Jer-
sey one-day events, the competi-
tion is split into two tournaments.
Thirty-one players competed in
Class A, those with handicaps of
scratch to 16, while fifty-two took
part in Class B.

Mrs. A. J. Bryant of Upper
Montclair, playing steadily except
for two holes on the inward nine,
tied for second low gross with
Mrs. T. V. Lyman of Maplewood.
Mrs. Bryant turned in nines of 40,
42, while Mrs. Lyman with the
best outward nine of the day, a
three-over-par 39 spoiled her score
coming back by carding 43.

After a three-over-par 8, on the
third hole, Mrs. James Dorment of
Montclair settled down to be next
in line with 43, 40—83. She was
tied by Mrs. Joseph Frelinghuysen
of Somerset Hills, who had nines
of 41, 42.

First low net prize in Class A
was won by Mrs. Jack Lasser of
Mount Ridge for her card of 86—
12—74 and Mrs. Frelinghuysen
took the second net award after
subtracting her handicap of 8 for
75.

In Class B Mrs. Elias Elin of
Preakness Hills captured low gross
with 49, 47—96, beating Mrs. W. V.
Cadmus of Baltusrol, who had 48,
49—97. Mrs. Helen Spain of Ma-
plewood was next with 50, 48—98.

Mrs. Mike Kosloff of Dellwood
played well enough to be in the

running even among the Class A players as she took now net for a card of 98, 22—76.

Mrs. Tracy rally wins Met golf

GREENWICH, Conn.—Mrs. William Tracy of Essex Falls rallied from the brink of defeat yesterday to dethrone Mrs. A. Sherburne Hart as the match-play champion of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association.

Mrs. Tracy was two down with two holes to go. But she won the last two regulation holes, then closed out the match on the first extra hole at the Stanwich Club. Mrs. Hart, playing out of Baltusrol in this all-New Jersey final to the 68th WMGA championship, flirted with traps all day on the difficult course.

She found 10 traps in her 37 holes of final-round play, and that made the difference. Mrs. Tracy had her short game working well, and it paid off in her first champion-

ship in three trips to the final. She lost in 1953, was beaten on the final hole by Maureen Orcutt of White Beeches in 1968.

Mrs. Hart looked like a sure winner going into the 35th with a two-up lead. But she hit her second shot into a pond parallel to the course, then hit over the green and conceded the hole to Mrs. Tracey's par-five.

Mrs. Hart still needed only a half on the 36th hole to retain her championship. But Mrs. Hart hooked into a trap, then hit over the green. She came back well to within four feet of the pin.

Mrs. Tracy canned a 20-foot uphill putt to win the hole and square the match, sending it into overtime.

The 37th, first on the course, is a dogleg to the left, with traps to the left and the pin placed in the left side of a green — not the easiest of problems.

Mrs. Tracy drove down the middle while Mrs. Hart hooked into some trees, then came out into a trap. But she blasted out well to within 10 feet. Mrs. Tracy took a five on the hole, and Mrs. Hart had a chance. But she three-putted from 10 feet and lost both the hole and the championship.

The morning half of the match saw the two contenders swap hole after hole. They were even after nine and even at the mid-point. Each shot an 84 on the 6,083-yard, par-74 course.

The 17th hole, that cost Mrs. Hart so heavily in the afternoon, was a problem for Mrs. Tracy in the morning. She hit into that enticing pond and lost the hole to fall back into a tie with the defender.

Mrs. Hart took the lead for the first time when she won the 20th hole. But she couldn't stay in front until she took the 27th and 28th holes for a two-up margin.

Another victory at the 30th stretched the margin to three holes.

But Mrs. Tracy started back by winning the 31st after Mrs. Hart found another of those ubiquitous traps.

Mrs. Tracy's Rally Wins Area Title on 37th Hole

GREENWICH, Conn., June 25 —Mrs. William Tracy of Essex Fells won the 68th annual Women's Metropolitan Golf Association tournament today, defeating the defending champion, Mrs. A. Sherburne Hart of Baltusrol, on the 37th green. Mrs. Hart had a 2-up lead after 34 holes.

Mrs. Hart, the medalist, had a great advantage in length off the tee on the 6,083-yard, par-74 Stanwich course, but Mrs. Tracy's great chipping and putting gave her the title for the first time in three finals.

They were even after the morning round. Mrs. Hart's long game is usually steady, but she found nine traps and several drives went into the water. Both players were 10 over par at the lunch break.

In the afternoon Mrs. Hart, with a par on the 20th, went 1 up for the first time. A 20-foot putt for a birdie 4 on the 23d squared the match for Mrs. Tracy. On the next few holes Mrs. Hart took command, reaching the 27th 1 up with a 39

and winning the 28th and 30th to go 3 up.

Mrs. Tracy was 2 down with two holes to go, but she won the 35th with a par when her opponent put her second into the pond and she squared the match with a 20-foot putt for a par on the 36th when Mrs. Hart hit a trap.

On the 37th Mrs. Hart needed three putts from five feet. After a great shot out of the trap, she went for victory on a tricky downhill putt. It rimmed the cup and spun downhill five feet and she missed again.

Mrs. Tracy had an 83, Mrs. Hart an 81.

At the presentation Mrs. Hart said, "If I had to lose to anyone, I'm glad it was you."

Mrs. Tracy Takes Medal With 75 In Metropolitan Title Golf Event

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., June 15—The Women's Metropolitan Golf Association's fiftieth anniversary championship got under way today over the Metropolis Country Club's course, with Mrs. William Tracy of Glen-Ridge winning the medal.

For the second year in a row a member of the Glen Ridge Country Club topped the qualifiers, as Mrs. Tracy, putting exceptionally well, turned in an even par 38, 37—75. Last year Mrs. Gordon Park tallied a 75 over the Upper Montclair course.

New Jersey golfers took the first three qualifying places. Mrs. Marge Mason of Ridgewood, the defending champion, who was an automatic qualifier but elected to try the course, and Mrs. Philip Cudone of Montclair, tied for second with identical cards.

The only other contestant in the field of 107 to break 80 was Mrs. Sophie Untermeyer of Century, the Wheeler Trophy champion. After a bad start of two 6's, or 3 over par, Mrs. Untermeyer settled down to play well for a 41, 38—79. Her par 38 for the inward nine was the second best of the day.

The course was in excellent condition, with the greens fast for putting but moderately slow for pitch shots. The lay-out measured 6,496 yards and the score of 90, which was necessary to gain the championship flight of thirty-two,

was lower than had been anticipated.

Among those bracketed at 82 were a former Metropolitan champion, Mrs. Mortimer May of Englewood, who had 42, 40, and Mrs. Saul Weinsier of Fresh Meadow and last year's runner-up, Roslyn (Cookie) Swift of Glen Oaks, each with 41, 41—82.

Mrs. Joseph H. Frelinghuysen Jr. of Somerset Hills, a semi-finalist in 1952, and Mrs. Reinert M. Torgerson of Cherry Valley, three times Metropolitan champion, qualified with 83's. Another former titleholder, Maureen Orcutt of Ridgewood was next with 84. This was the same score turned in by Mrs. Allison Choate of Apawamis, the Tri-County champion, and Mrs. William Stockhausen of the Creek.

Making her first appearance in this championship since before the war, Mrs. Allan Ryan of the Creek qualified with 87. Mrs. Ryan, who was runner-up in 1940 at Montclair, played well on the first nine to have 41, but posted 46 on the second nine.

Among those who failed to make the championship flight were Judy Frank of Aldecress and Jane Goss of Somerset Hills. After a beautiful second shot to within six feet of the pin on the eighteenth, Miss Goss missed the putt that would have made her score 90 and gotten Miss Goss into the top flight.

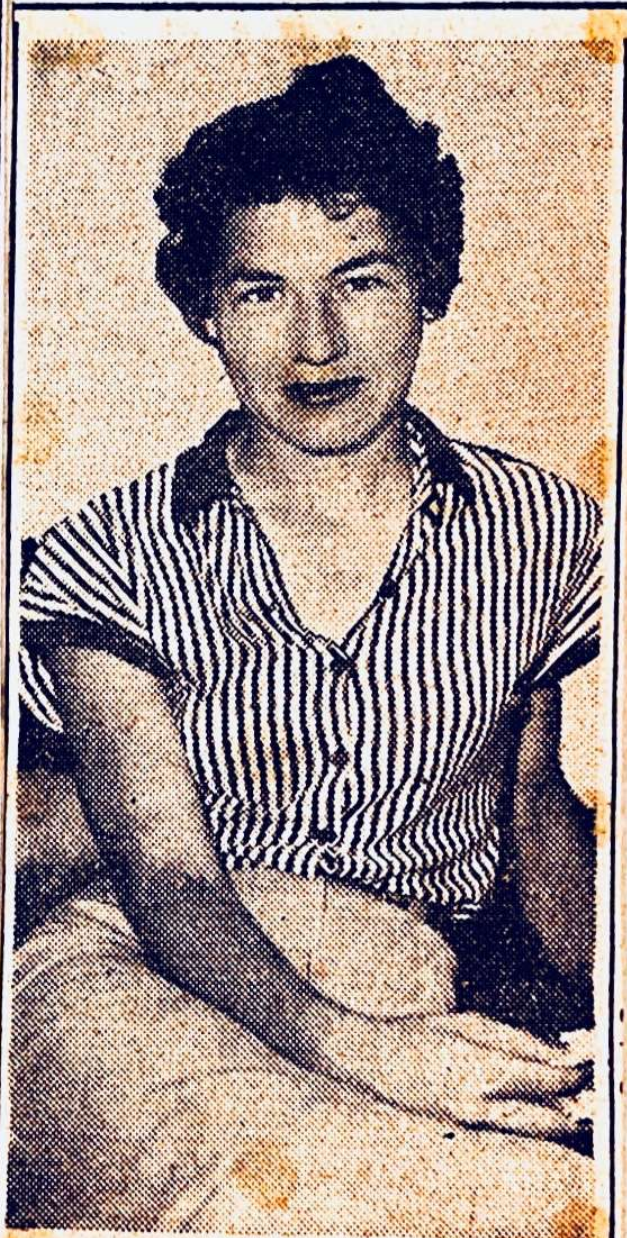

DEAL, N. J., Aug. 1—Mrs. William Tracy of Essex Fells scored a 44, 40-84 at the Hollywood Golf Club today and won her sixth title in 16 years in the 35th annual Women's Metropolitan Golf Association Shore tournament. Her 54-hole total was 243.

Mrs. Tracy, who led after two rounds at the Rumson and Deal clubs, was 10 over par on the Hollywood course of 5,042 yards.

Trailing Mrs. Tracy was the 1951 winner, Miss Charlotte DeCozen of Westchester, with 244. Mrs. Tracy won the title in 1953, 1960, 1961, 1963 and 1964 and was third last year.

Mrs. Pat Cici of the Cedar Brook Country Club was unable to defend her 1967 title because of injury.

Essene DeCouzen Gets Second Place With 244 in Jersey Shore 54-Hole Tourney

DEAL, N. J., Aug. 6—Mrs. William Tracy of Glen Ridge rallied on the last nine today at the Hollywood Golf Club to win the Women's New Jersey Golf Association's three-day shore tournament with a fifty-four-hole total of 240.

Her total in the event, played at three different courses, was four shots lower than the score posted by Essene DeCouzen of Montclair, who made a hole-in-one today in her bid to overtake the Glen Ridge player.

Mrs. Tracy, who started the day's play with a three-stroke lead over Miss DeCouzen, scored a concluding 42, 40—82 and added another shot to her lead when Miss DeCouzen scored a 41, 42—83 for a total of 244.

At the end of ten holes Mrs. Tracy led Miss DeCouzen by one shot. But the Glen Ridge golfer birdied three holes en route to the finish for her victory.

Miss DeCouzen got her ace on the 125-yard fourth hole, where she hit a No. 5 iron shot into the cup. She had only two pars on the front nine.

The tournament's net winner was Mrs. Norman W. Glauber of High Ridge on a 214 total.

Mrs. Tracy rally wins Met golf

GREENWICH, Conn.—Mrs. William Tracy of Essex Falls rallied from the brink of defeat yesterday to dethrone Mrs. A. Sherburne Hart as the match-play champion of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association.

Mrs. Tracy was two down with two holes to go. But she won the last two regulation holes, then closed out the match on the first extra hole at the Stanwich Club. Mrs. Hart, playing out of Baltusrol in this all-New Jersey final to the 68th WMGA championship, flirted with traps all day on the difficult course.

She found 10 traps in her 37 holes of final-round play, and that made the difference. Mrs. Tracy had her short game working well, and it paid off in her first champion-

ship in three trips to the final. She lost in 1953, was beaten on the final hole by Maureen Orcutt of White Beeches in 1968.

Mrs. Hart looked like a sure winner going into the 35th with a two-up lead. But she hit her second shot into a pond parallel to the course, then hit over the green and conceded the hole to Mrs. Tracey's par-five.

Mrs. Hart still needed only a half on the 36th hole to retain her championship. But Mrs. Hart hooked into a trap, then hit over the green. She came back well to within four feet of the pin.

Mrs. Tracy canned a 20-foot uphill putt to win the hole and square the match, sending it into overtime.

The 37th, first on the course, is a dogleg to the left, with traps to the left and the pin placed in the left side of a green — not the easiest of problems.

Mrs. Tracy drove down the middle while Mrs. Hart hooked into some trees, then came out into a trap. But she blasted out well to within 10 feet. Mrs. Tracy took a five on the hole, and Mrs. Hart had a chance. But she three-putted from 10 feet and lost both the hole and the championship.

The morning half of the match saw the two contenders swap hole after hole. They were even after nine and even at the mid-point. Each shot an 84 on the 6,083-yard, par-74 course.

The 17th hole, that cost Mrs. Hart so heavily in the afternoon, was a problem for Mrs. Tracy in the morning. She hit into that enticing pond and lost the hole to fall back into a tie with the defender.

Mrs. Hart took the lead for the first time when she won the 20th hole. But she couldn't stay in front until she took the 27th and 28th holes for a two-up margin.

Another victory at the 30th stretched the margin to three holes.

But Mrs. Tracy started back by winning the 31st after Mrs. Hart found another of those ubiquitous traps.

Mrs. Tracy's Rally Wins Area Title on 37th Hole

GREENWICH, Conn., June 25 —Mrs. William Tracy of Essex Fells won the 68th annual Women's Metropolitan Golf Association tournament today, defeating the defending champion, Mrs. A. Sherburne Hart of Baltusrol, on the 37th green. Mrs. Hart had a 2-up lead after 34 holes.

Mrs. Hart, the medalist, had a great advantage in length off the tee on the 6,083-yard, par-74 Stanwich course, but Mrs. Tracy's great chipping and putting gave her the title for the first time in three finals.

They were even after the morning round. Mrs. Hart's long game is usually steady, but she found nine traps and several drives went into the water. Both players were 10 over par at the lunch break.

In the afternoon Mrs. Hart, with a par on the 20th, went 1 up for the first time. A 20-foot putt for a birdie 4 on the 23d squared the match for Mrs. Tracy. On the next few holes Mrs. Hart took command, reaching the 27th 1 up with a 39

and winning the 28th and 30th to go 3 up.

Mrs. Tracy was 2 down with two holes to go, but she won the 35th with a par when her opponent put her second into the pond and she squared the match with a 20-foot putt for a par on the 36th when Mrs. Hart hit a trap.

On the 37th Mrs. Hart needed three putts from five feet. After a great shot out of the trap, she went for victory on a tricky downhill putt. It rimmed the cup and spun downhill five feet and she missed again.

Mrs. Tracy had an 83, Mrs. Hart an 81.

At the presentation Mrs. Hart said, "If I had to lose to anyone, I'm glad it was you."
