

# MISS KNAPP TAKES LOW GROSS HONORS

Cards an 82 to Lead Field of  
102 Golfers in One-Day  
Handicap Tournament.

GLEN HEAD, L. I., July 16.—Leading her two nearest rivals by a margin of six strokes, Miss Rosalie Knapp of the home club captured low gross honors in the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association one-day handicap tournament over the Women's National Golf and Tennis Club course today.

Miss Knapp turned in a score of 39—43—82, five over women's par for the course, while her club-mate, Mrs. Leonard Cushing, and Miss Nancy Marmon of Salisbury tied for second with gross scores of 88.

In the low net competition first prize was taken by Mrs. O. C. W. Peterson of Pomonok after matching cards with Mrs. Charles Gleason, Cherry Valley golfer. Mrs. Peterson carded 94—21—73 against Mrs. Gleason's 97—24—73, the latter receiving the second low net award.

The field numbered 102, the largest number to play in this event in two years.

Miss Knapp, who is president of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association, was off to a good start with two birdies on the first nine. Coming in, Miss Knapp got her third birdie on the tenth, but was one over par on each of the next five holes. She equaled par figures on the last three, however.
