

MISS ANNENBERG WINS WITH AN 84

Takes One-Day Golf Tourney
at Pomonok C. C., Defeating
Mrs. Missir 2 Strokes.

LOW NET TO MRS. COCKLIN

Records 97-21-76 and Gains
Prize After Matching Cards
With Mrs. Masury.

Miss Sylva Annenberg, holder of the New York State championship, yesterday entered a Women's Metropolitan Golf Association one-day tournament for the first time in many months, and won handily with an 84, two strokes better than her nearest competitor, Mrs. M. G. Missir of the Westchester C. C.

Miss Annenberg negotiated the first nine holes of the comparatively short Pomonok Country Club course in 38, or even par for women. The Fresh Meadow star, who recently returned from an extensive Western tour, got a birdie 4 at the seventh, then a par 4 at the next, but went one over at the ninth.

Wind Bothers Victor.

Coming in, the winner was considerably bothered by a fitful wind. She was over on five holes for a 46, going two over at the par 4 fourteenth. At the short seventeenth the wind stopped the ball in a hollow short of the green, and a fine chip-up was followed by two putts.

But on the home hole Miss Annenberg went back to her early style. Just short of the green in 2, she needed two for her 84. She curled a chip shot to within eight feet of the cup and sank the putt.

Mrs. Arthur Cocklin of the Old Country Club won first low net, 97-21-76, after her card had been matched with the 88-12-76 of Mrs. J. A. Masury, champion of the home club. It was Mrs. Masury, however, who had the prize shot of the day, On the long par 6 twelfth, she was just over the green in 3 and then sank a delicate 20-foot chip for an eagle 4.
