Mr. and Mrs. Tracy Retain Robbins Trophy by 2 Strokes

PURCHASE, N. Y., July 30.—

Mr. and Mrs. William Tracy, the crack twosome from Essex Fells, N. J., today retained their husband-and-wife championship of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association, played for the twenty-third time over the Century Country Club's course.

The Tracy's kept the handsome Jane Robbins Memorial Trophy for another year by combining a nifty 40—30—79 under the alternate shot system of play. Their round which included a 6 on the par-four fifteenth hole was two strokes better than those of Mr. and Mrs. T. U. Lyman, of Maplewood, N. J., and Mr. and Mrs. Saul Weinsier, of Fresh Meadow.

A record number of sixty-five pairs participated in the event, and many last-minute entries were turned away. It was a perfect day for golf and the course was in excellent shape considering the current heat wave.

Except for some bad luck on the final holes, the Tracy pair played very well, indeed. At the fifteenth, Mrs. Tracy found a trap and her husband missed his shot getting out. At the seventeenth they were forty yards from the pin in two and then took four more strokes to get down. And on the eighteenth green they three-putted for a bogie 5.

Still, they weren't bothered as much as Mr. and Mrs. Reinert Torgerson, the Cherry Valley combination which has won many times in the past. The Torgersons started their round with a 7 at the first hole, taking two penalty strokes for a lost ball, and they were to lose another one before returning with 43—40—83.

The first of eight low net prizes was claimed by Mr. and Mrs. Irving Kaufman, of Century, who had 83—14—69. Their closest competitors were Dr.

and Mrs. Raymond Topol, of Elmwood, who had 85—12—73.
