

Miss Johnston Takes Windle Trophy in 1-Day Golf Tourney

Field of 148 Turns Out for Match Play Against Par at Westchester Course

RYE, N. Y., Oct. 6.—A new trophy was put in play by 148 women golfers today at the Westchester Country Club. The Joseph J. Windle Challenge Cup, given by the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association to Miss Josephine Windle in memory of Miss Windle's father, was presented for the first time by Miss Windle to Miss Barbara Johnston, of Knollwood, who emerged the winner of the one-day match play against par tourney.

The field was a record turnout for a late season W. M. G. A. affair, rarely equaled even in high season tourneys, and was, in effect, a testimonial in honor of Miss Windle, who has been the W. M. G. A. tournament chairman for ten years. The cup was named for the late Mr. Windle in honor and appreciation of the keen interest he showed in the women's association for many years, an interest which went so far that he donated one of his offices at 110 William Street to their use.

The trophy was given to Miss Windle at the final 1935 meeting of the association and with it the prerogative of choice of the locale, date and manner in which the tourney for it should be played.

As the large field came slowly in throughout the afternoon Miss Windle, watching its progress as she has watched over the tournaments of the association for ten summers, said that she chose the Westchester Country Club as the scene of the first challenge cup competition because it was here that she saw her first American women's golf tournament. Although she is a native American Miss Windle made her first acquaintance with the game of golf in Scotland when she accompanied Miss Alexia Stirling to the British women's championship. Not long after her return she switched her allegiance from tennis to golf, and then rapidly became the guiding force in the development of the fine tournament organization which exists in the W. M. G. A. today.

The competition against par for her trophy today became not only extensive but intensive. Miss Johnston finished tied with Miss Marion Fisher, of Lakeville, and Mrs. Jerome Patterson, of Lawrence Farm, all three of whom were square with par in match play terms on the eighteenth. Stroke allowance was figured on the basis of three-quarters of the handicap. Miss Fisher benefited from a handicap of 2; Miss Johnston, 14, and Mrs. Patterson, 17. Their medal scores, respectively, were 77, two over women's par, 98 and 94, the last an admirable display of golf for a player with as high a handicap as Mrs. Patterson.

The top ranking trio's cards were matched to break the deadlock, but it was to no avail. The matching produced only a vicious circle. Miss Johnston defeating Mrs. Patterson, 2 up; Mrs. Patterson defeating Miss Fisher, 1 up, and Miss Fisher defeating Miss Johnston, 2 up. The matter

was finally settled by elimination, drawing two cards and matching them, and then matching the winner against the third, on which basis Mrs. Patterson eliminated Miss Fisher and was in turn eliminated by Miss Johnston. The cards:
