

COLLETT BOWS TO MISS BROADWELL

National Golf Champion Loses,
4 and 3, in Westchester
Interclub Series.

STAGES BRILLIANT RALLY

Victor, One Down at End of First
Nine, Scores 39 for Incoming
Route at Century Club.

WHITE PLAINS, N. Y., May 6.—
The defeat of Miss Gienna Collett by
Miss Jane Broadwell of the West-
chester Country Club cost the Green-
wich Country Club a victory over
Westchester in the second of the se-
ries of interclub team matches of the
Westchester division of the Women's
Metropolitan Golf Association today.
The downfall of the women's na-
tional champion came on the dif-
ficult Century Country Club course,
and, although it was the No. 1 en-
counter, it proved the deciding mar-
gin in the end. Westchester tri-
umphed over Greenwich, 8 to 6½
points, while Winged Foot, the third
member of the threesome, tallied only
a half point.

Despite Miss Broadwell's sparkling
triumph, by 4 and 3, Quaker Ridge
took high scoring honors for the day
by registering 8½ points. But even
this was insufficient to head off the
Westchester C. C., which leads in
total points for the series with 16.
Then comes Quaker Ridge with 13½,
Century with 13, Greenwich with 12½
and Woodway with 11½.

Miss Broadwell played brilliantly
against Miss Collett, especially on the
incoming nine when she turned in a
splendid card of 39, after being 1
down at the turn. Miss Collett had
some trouble with her putting and
registered a 45 on the last nine. This,
together with her outward 42, gave
her 87 for the day, as against 43, 39-
82 for her opponent.

Miss Broadwell's only bad hole on
the inward journey was the 135-yard
sixteenth, where she three-putted for
a 5 on the par three hole. This, how-
ever, came after the match was of-
ficially ended, as the participants
played out the eighteen holes. The
third member of the threesome, Mrs.
D. M. Willard of Winged Foot,
scored a 94.

was high scorer with 8 points to in-
crease its aggregate to 13. Leewood,
which tallied 5½ today, is second in
total points with 12½.

wich C. C.
