

Miss Singer and Miss Pietsch Tie For Medal in Westchester Golf

Young Players Each Card 86; Field of More Than Seventy-five Tees Off

PORT CHESTER, N. Y., June 20.—Miss Catherine Singer, of Westchester Country Club, and Miss Betty Pietsch, of Tamarack, two of the best young golfers in this district, turned in 86s today and tied for the medal in the qualifying round of the tenth annual Women's Westchester Fairfield Golf Association championships, played over the Tamarack Country Club course today.

Both Miss Singer and Miss Pietsch had almost similar cards, doing the outgoing nine in 44s and the incoming nine in 42s, seven over the eighteen-hole women's par. A field of more than seventy-five took part in the opening round of the tournament, which will run through Friday.

Miss Evans Third With 87

Miss Jane Evans, defending champion, was third, turning in an 87. Last year's medallist, Miss Helen Silleck, qualified with 92. All of the favorites came through to qualify, although such well known golfers as Mrs. S. S. Laird and Mrs. I. M. Willard could not make the first sixteen.

Mrs. Thomas Hucknall, Connecticut State champion, played a 91 to qualify, and Miss Marie Jenney and Miss Frances Snyder also were among the leaders.

Both of the medallists played their best golf coming in, going two over par, although Miss Pietsch's 5 on the short par 3 fifteenth was costly. She matched Miss Singer stroke for stroke on the last three holes. Miss Singer went one over on the 353-yard tenth for a 5 and took an extra stroke on the twelfth. Miss Singer had ten par holes, Miss Pietsch eight pars and two birdies.

Miss Frances Snyder, the young Apawamis member, was eighth, turning in 43—47—90. Mrs. Arnold Jackson, former Metropolitan titleholder, just barely qualified, winning out with Mrs. L. C. Du Bois, Westchester Fairfield team captain, and Mrs. G. S. Studwell, in a play-off with Mrs. Harback Halstead and Mrs. Charles Russell, who also had 94s. Miss Jenney, also a former Metropolitan titleholder, qualified with 46—47—93.
