

Mrs. Tracy, Charlotte De Cozen Take Medal With 70 at Leewood

Mrs. May and Peggy Mackie Next With 72 as Mrs. Bartol-Gail Wild Withdraw After Posting 70 in 4-Ball Tourney

CRESTWOOD, N. Y., July 7—Mrs. William Tracy of Glen Ridge and Charlotte De Cozen of Baltusrol won the qualifying medal in the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association's four-ball match-play tournament at Leewood today, turning in a best-ball one-under-par 33, 37—70 to head a field of thirty-six teams.

Mrs. John H. Bartol of Greenwich, Westchester and Fairfield champion, and Gail Wild toured the hilly 6,253-yard course in 35, 35—70. They forfeited their medal rights, however, because Mrs. Bartol's recent illness made it necessary for them to withdraw from the match-play rounds that start tomorrow. Mrs. Bartol is permitted to play only once or twice a month and not in competition.

In second place was Mrs. Mortimer May of Englewood and Peggy Mackie of Inwood at 36, 36—72. There was a three-way tie for third at 74 and the low figure of 76 was needed to make the first flight of eight teams for the match play, which continues through Friday.

In the triple tie were Roslyn (Cookie) Swift of Glen Oaks, metropolitan champion, and Mrs. Saul Weinsier of Fresh Meadow, with 37, 37; Mrs. Bernard Freeman of Inwood and Mrs. Marge Mason of Ridgewood, 36, 38, and Mrs. Sophie Untermeyer of Century and Mrs. Sally Francis of Apawamis, also 36, 38.

Because Mrs. Henry March and Mrs. Irving Kaufman of Century with a score of 76, had left before a play-off became necessary for eighth place, the other three teams with the same score automatically qualified.

They were Mrs. Allison Choate of Apawamis, Tri-County champion, and Mrs. Joseph Nesbitt of Westchester, president of the Metropolitan Association; Mrs. Jerome Herbert of Old Oaks and Mrs. Donald O'Brien of Winged Foot, and Rosalind Kaufmann of Sunningdale and Mrs. Clarence P. Greer of Fairview.

The medalists had five birdies in their round.
