Baltusrol Player Succeeds Mrs. Nesbitt as President of Metropolitan Body

Mrs. Theodore W. Hawes of Baltusrol Golf Club was elected president of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association at the group's annual meeting yesterday at the Hotel Shelton.

The fifty-second annual women's metropolitan championship will be played over the Ridgewood Country Club the second week in June. The only other dates announced by the new tournament chairman, Mrs. Kessenich, was the Robbins Memorial husband-and-wife tournament scheduled for Glen Oaks in July, and the junior girls two-day championship at North Hempstead, L. I., in August.
