

WEINSIERS & ZAHNS CAPTURE HUSBAND-WIFE TITLES



It's no wonder Mrs. Saul Weinsier, Fresh Meadow, was caught kissing her husband after winning the Robbins Memorial tournament at Garden City. "Husband and Wife Champions of the W.M.G.A." is an enviable title and the Weinsiers captured it for the first time by scoring 38-40-78. Only one shot behind them were the 1953 and 1954 victors, Mr. and Mrs. William Tracy, Essex Falls. Three teams tied at 80: Mr. and Mrs. Charles Spalding, Round Hill; Mr. and Mrs. David Baldwin, Baltusrol; and Mr. and Mrs. Reinert Torgerson, Meadowbrook. First low net honors went to Mr. and Mrs. Jack Liberman, Hampshire, with 81-11-70. The Lawrence Manheimers, Metropolis, took second net with 81-8-73.

After two years of dethronement, the Leonard Zahns emerged again as victors of the Ruth March Trophy for the Class B husband and wife event. Mr. and Mrs. Zahn, Glen Oaks, won this event with 42-43-85 in 1955; placed second in 1956 with 43-45-88, and were victorious this year with 44-38-82. First low net on the draw went to Mr. and Mrs. Morris Lipstein, Glen Head, who toured Island Hills with 89-16-73; followed by two other Glen Head couples: Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Gans, 92-19-73, and Mr. and Mrs. Jules Mittleman, 90-17-73.

BALDINGS WIN MOTHER-SON IN PLAY-OFF WITH HIGGINSES

MANHEIMER-LANN TAKE FATHER-DAUGHTER WITH 76

Being the year for the return of previous champions, it was only natural that Mrs. Lawrence Manheimer, Metropolis, and her father, Joseph Lann, Briar Hill, should win. They had been the victors in 1955 and shot a four-over-par 37-39-76 at Upper Montclair to regain the Father-Daughter Championship title this year. Mrs. Manheimer and her father were the only twosome in the field to break 80 in this competition. Mrs. Richard Fuld and Jack W. Schwab, both of Quaker Ridge and former champions, finished second, as they did last year, with the same score of 84. Nineteen year-old Sybil Wolfensohn and her father, Leo Wolfensohn, Engineers, were awarded the low net trophy for the second consecutive year, scoring 85-12-73.
