The Winged Foot team of Mrs. Fred E. Wright and Mrs. Paul Frederick had a 41 on the first nine but returned in 47.

At 89, Mrs. Ralph Shirkes of Ryewood and Mrs. Samuel Shulman of Fenway were tied with the Old Oaks team of Mrs. Alfred Slaner and Mrs. Herbert Booth.
