Mrs. Hawes Takes Senior Golf Title With 159

JERSEYAN GETS 78 AND WINS BY SHOT

**Mrs. Hawes Dethrones Mrs.
Vare, Who Slumps to 82
in Wind-Up at Rye**

RYE, N. Y., Sept. 28—Mrs. Theodore W. Hawes of Summit, N. J., became the champion of the United States Senior Women's Golf Association today.

The Baltusrol Country Club player scored 39, 39—78 over the South Course at Westchester C. C. to triumph with a 36-hole total of 159.

Mrs. Hawes, the runner-up 1957 through 1959, began the second half of this tournament three strokes behind. She had opened with 43, 38—81.

The margin by which Mrs. Hawes dethroned Mrs. Edwin H. Vare Jr. of Bryn Mawr, Pa., was a stroke. Mrs. Vare, the former Glenna Collett, six times was the United States amateur champion. She took a three-stroke lead over four players with 39, 39—78 yesterday.

Today, Mrs. Vare had difficulty with her putting and scored 44, 38—82 for an aggregate of 160. She three-putted six of the first twelve greens.

Mrs. Hawes, a former Women's Metropolitan Golf Association senior champion and former head of the organization, carded 10 pars and two birdies in the final round. One birdie was a 2 at the 180-yard fourteenth hole.

The 36-hole net honors for the Harriette Bassler Memorial Trophy were taken by Mrs. Courtland Smith of Glen Ridge, N. J., competing in Class B (handicaps of 17 through 24). Mrs. Smith won with 181—42—139 after scoring 93 and 88.
