

# Miss Paine Takes Orcutt Event Again

## Records An 80 To Defeat Kathy Linney By Five Strokes In Golf Playoff

Haworth — Sandy Paine, 16-year-old veteran of tournament golf, won her second straight Maureen Orcutt Golf Tournament yesterday at White Beeches when she shot an 80 to defeat Kathy Linney of Scotch Plains by five strokes.

It was the second straight year that Miss Paine was forced into a playoff before she won the championship. She also had an 80 last year when she bested Zonnie Tracy of Essex Fells.

The West Orange golfer had 41-39 for her 80 while Miss Linney, 17, posted a 43-42.

The story might have been a little different if Miss Linney had more luck on the ninth hole. Trailing by a stroke coming into the par 5 hole, she was just short of the green with her second shot. However, she shanked the third shot and instead of having a good chance for a birdie, she finished with a six. Miss Paine took a par, enabling her to pick up a stroke

instead of being tied at the turn.

Both had good tee shots on the 10th, but Miss Linney was a little too far to the left, which is supposed to be the safe side, and she lost another stroke.

Trying to finish strongly on the 18th, Miss Linney put her tee shot 6 feet from the pin as she used a 3 iron on the 185-yard hole. Instead of a birdie deuce, however, she took a four when she charged the cup with her putt and the ball went by.

Except for a poor third hole, Miss Paine would have been the master from the start as she opened with a pair of fours for a 2-stroke lead. However, she had a six on the next hole and lost her entire advantage.

Miss Paine has been playing in the Orcutt golf event for 4 years and is much more experienced than her opponent, who is a comparative novice at tourney play. It was Miss Linney's first try for the trophy. Both girls had 82 when the tourney was played on August 29.
