Her son, David, is a junior at Boston University and involved in a most interesting project. David is making an underwater movie at Andros Island in the Bahamas.

None of the three Doubilet offspring are golfers. Mrs. Doubilet told me, "They are interested in my golf, but they figure one golfer in the family is enough."
