

Mrs. Doubilet Wins by Stroke In Senior Golf With 81 for 165

WHITE PLAINS, Oct. 15 — Mrs. Henry Doubilet of Hollywood won the 20th annual Women's Metropolitan Golf Association senior championship today at the Fenway Golf Club.

Mrs. Doubilet, playing in fog and heavy rain, turned in a round of 40, 41 — 81 over the 5,795-yard, par-74 course. Added to her first-round score of 84, it gave her a 36-hole total of 165 and a one-stroke victory.

This was the first important tournament victory for Mrs. Doubilet, a 55-year-old mother of three. She took home the Clara Rossin Trophy, donated by the late Mrs. Robert Ackerman in honor of her mother.

Maybe one victory inspired another, for last week at Fort Lauderdale, Fla., Mrs. Doubilet won the United States Golf Association's Group B prize for players 55 to 60 years old.

In second place today was Mrs. E.C.K. Finch of the New Canaan Country Club, the women's United States senior champion. She missed three putts on the back nine as she scored a 41, 44—85.

Yesterday's leader, Mrs. Justine Cushing of Piping Rock, started off with pars on the first four holes, but she took an 11 on the 430-yard, par-5 fifth, missing shots in traps because of the wet sand. Mrs.

Cushing finished with an 89, which gave her 169 and third place.

Mrs. Karl Clement of Nassau was fourth with an 88 today for 170.

The defending champion, Maureen Orcutt of White Beeches, tied for fifth place at 171 with Mrs. J. B. Balding of Piping Rock. Miss Orcutt took a 7 and 8 on the third and fourth holes and finished with an 89.

Mrs. Balding, playing one of the better rounds, scored a 41, 45—85 for 171. Mrs. Balding was the winner of first low net after subtracting a two-day handicap of 26 for a 145.

The field, which started Wednesday with 46 contestants, had only 24 players complete the 36 holes.
