

Noble, Waters, Young, Hawes gain semifinal

Karen Noble, the 1987 New Jersey Amateur champion and a student at Wake Forest University, led the advance to the semifinal round of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association's Match-Play Championship yesterday at Somerset Hills in Bernardsville.

Noble, medalist in the tournament's qualifying action, bested Helen Aitken of Montclair, 6 and 4. Maura Waters of Raritan Valley, also one of the pre-tournament favorites, Donna Young of Springdale and Reggie Hawes of Westchester in New York also reached today's semifinal round.

Waters, who recently graduated from Rutgers where she set eight scoring records for the women's team and recently won the Garden State Women's Golf Association 36-hole Stroke-Play tournament by 11 strokes, was a 3 and 2 winner over Linda Schnoll of Shackamaxon.

Young ousted Derby Campbell of Canoe Brook, 6 and 4, and Hawes edged Jean Crawford of Apawamis in New York, 1 up.

Noble will oppose Hawes and Waters takes on Young today. The winners will meet in a 36-hole final tomorrow.
