

Golfers seeking Met title

Maura Waters and Linda Schnoll, the two surviving players from Central Jersey, faced each other today in the quarterfinals of the Women's Metropolitan Golf Association match play championship at Somerset Hills Country Club in Bernardsville.

Waters, of Raritan Valley, and Schnoll, of Shackamaxon, each won two matches yesterday.

Former Rutgers star Waters beat Ann Probert of Somerset Hills on the 20th hole in the first round, and then ousted Lee Ann Vogel of Southward Ho, Long Island, 3 and 2, in the second round.

Schnoll topped Sue Dilley on the 19th hole in the opening round, and then nipped Ria Noble of Morris County, 1-up.

Beanie Kelley of Somerset Hills topped clubmate Brigid Lamb, 2-up, in the first round but lost to Derby Campbell of Canoe Brook, 5 and 4.

First-round losers included Evelyn Pyne of Somerset Hills, who bowed 2 and 1 to Anne Lanyi of Roxiticus; and Virginia Dillon, also of Somerset Hills, who bowed 1-up to Mary McCurdy of Baltusrol. McCurdy then lost 5 and 3 to Reggie Hawes of Westchester CC.

Qualifying medalist Karen Noble of Morris County, No. 1 player for Wake Forest, was only 1-over-par in successive 7 and 6 victories. Noble's second round victim was Lanyi.

The semifinals, also at a scheduled 18 holes, will be played tomorrow, with the final, scheduled for 36 holes, slated Friday.
